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### *A message from your Board...*

It appears we are now officially in the Dog Days. Wikipedia defines the dog days or dog days of summer as the hot, sultry days of summer. They are now taken to be the hottest, most uncomfortable part of summer in the Northern Hemisphere. Sound like Florida in the summer? Actually living here in Florida in the summertime has some nice features as well; No wait for a table in the restaurants, spots to park your car downtown and less people at the beaches. 

At our regular Board meeting in July, we had some interesting business transacted, but the really important aspect of how this community operates was evident as well. We operate on volunteer sweat equity. At that meeting, we appointed a new member to our compliance committee. I announced that several former Board members had stepped forward to work on, as well as chair, this year's Nominating Committee. And the Social Committee asked that the task of decorating the community on national holidays with American Flags be offered to a new committee. We asked Paula to put up a sign-up sheet on our Bulletin Board and ask if you can and are interested in seeing the community decorated in the future, that you consider signing up. I recounted a story of a member several years ago that sent the Social Committee a rather terse e-mail telling them what he thought of the way the flags were displayed. He went on to complain about when they were put out, as well as how quickly they were removed, everything negative from him. The Social committee chair emailed him back inviting him to join in the task next time and mentioning that they were volunteers and would certainly welcome his help. He never replied. Please remember it's your community too, many things are accomplished here at Lakeridge Falls by our volunteers or not at all.

While mentioning the Social Committee: I would like to point out that at long last the community

association has finally replaced our microphone system. The Board appreciates the generosity and patience of the Social Committee in having loaned their microphone system to us for so long in the past for our Board Meetings, Thank you.

Finally I'd like to talk about water. We have a community irrigation system, it comprises a well and a distribution system that reaches the entire community via an extensive PVC pipe system that is essentially 15 years old and occasionally springs leaks. It sometimes seems that the Gremlins that control the system conspire to have it breakdown on Friday afternoons just after the property manager leaves for the weekend. If you spot a problem during the week call Oded. If on the weekend call a Board member and we can shut down the entire system until the Artstree technician comes on site Monday morning. We also have County water delivered to each dwelling via your Backflow pipe in your front yard. The community has a licensed plumber certify these backflows once a year (fee is in your assessment). If you spring a leak in your backflow you need to turn off your water and call a plumber. It's not a bad idea to occasionally check the backflow to see if it's starting to leak and if so have it checked out. Enjoy the Dog Days.

## Property Manager's Report

**Painting** – Recently, you received a revised Homeowner Painting Package in the mail. The revised package includes an addendum page which explains the recent resolutions adopted by the Board of Directors. Mainly, it states:

- a. that the current assigned color scheme remains the official color scheme of the Association
- b. that some exceptions are allowed, and
- c. that in order to file for an exception one must include the desired name, color formula, a color chip or sample, painter, paint phase and completion date.

The addendum page also explains that Phase A and Phase B assigned schedules were combined allowing both phases to complete the painting of the homes by December 31st, 2017. The rest of the package includes an overview of the painting project, the specifications a homeowner must follow, a copy of a Painting Submittal Form, the updated Assigned Paint Color Schemes, and the Updated Assigned Schedule. If you have any question regarding this project, please, and as always, feel free to contact me.



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**Irrigation**– During a routine walk with ArtisTree managers, one of the irrigation zones on Victoria Falls Circle started unexpectedly to work. It was discovered soon after that the irrigation clock, number 5, controlling this zone had smoke coming out of it. For those who may not know, an irrigation clock is an electrical device that is used to set the irrigation sprinklers and routers to come on automatically at preset times. Apparently, the breaker box controlling the irrigation clock box had some kind of a malfunction causing the shortage at the irrigation clock box. We immediately turned off all breakers and called Arctic Air Electric, LakeRidge Falls’ electrical company. Arctic Air Electric was able to replace the entire breaker box the following day. At the same time, we learned that an ArtisTree mower hit the breaker box that day causing this unpleasant chain of events. Needless to say that ArtisTree took full responsibility for this unfortunate incident paying for both the new breaker box and irrigation clock. Two weeks passed and a surge resulting from lightning had burned another irrigation clock located near the back gate. This specific irrigation clock, number 6, is located on the east corner of Victoria Falls Circle and LakeRidge Blvd and controls the irrigation along both sides of the wall. That said, it took ArtisTree a few hours but eventually the issue was repaired and the irrigation system is working up to par.

**Gates** – Last month, one of LakeRidge Falls’ residents informed us that the Mi Pueblo pedestrian gate was not working correctly. Upon inspection, I noticed that the Kant-Slam hydraulic closer, the device that regulates the self closing of the gate, broke completely off from the post. We immediately placed a call with Sunstate Gate, LakeRidge Falls’ gate maintenance company. Upon his inspection, Sunstate technician determined that corrosion caused the damage. After he fixed the issue, he recommended installing a gate stopper. This, he argued, would prevent this from reoccurring even if the Kant-Slam becomes corroded because it eliminates some of pressure that caused it to happen. The job was completed a couple of days following this recommendation. While on site, we

asked them to also replace the Kant-Slam hydraulic closers on all the pool gates and pedestrian gate at the north emergency gate.

On a related issue, we received reports during one of the weekends that the back Lockwood Ridge gates were acting out. The exit gate was stuck closed while the entry gate was stuck open. Therefore, the President of the Association, Mr. Dick Dorn, placed an urgent service call with Sunstate Gate. Within an hour, a Sunstate technician was on site. He discovered that a surge resulting from lightning had burned two of the arms motherboards and three loop detectors. In general, the motherboards are pretty much the brain of the systems while the loop detectors are the devices which sense vehicles passing or arriving thus opening and closing the gates. It took the tech a couple of hours to correct the issue but at the end it was said everything was working up to par.

**Fire Backflow Leak** – A few weeks ago, one of Sandstone Neighborhood’s residents informed me that the large fire line backflow located on the north entrance to the Clubhouse parking lot was leaking. In super simple terms, the fire line backflow device, much like your residential backflow, is designed to protect drinking water supplies from being contaminated due to a drop in water pressure. Following the report, we placed a service call with Piper Fire Protection, LakeRidge Falls’ fire system service and maintenance company. Following a short inspection, Piper technician determined that the 4” outlet OS&Y (outside stem and yoke) gate valve had to be repacked. Although this may sound super technical, in reality it was a very simple fix. Inside the valve there are 3 packing glands, which look like fabric o-rings. So, the tech removed the bolts and nuts covering them, pulled them out, installed new ones, and re-secured the bolts and nuts back. Fancy terms, simple fix. When he was done, the leak was over and the backflow was said to be in good working condition.

**Fire Extinguishers** – Staying with Piper Fire Protection, one of their technicians was one site recently performing the annual fire extinguishers inspection and emergency light check. As described in the past, Lakeridge Falls has five extinguishers which are located in the following areas:

Guardhouse – one extinguisher,

- Clubhouse HVAC Room – one extinguisher,
- Clubhouse Hallway – two extinguishers,
- Pool (i.e. right before you enter the Fitness Center) – one extinguishers.

The technician inspected the five extinguishers making sure there were no signs of denting, pitting, or corrosion on the vessels. He also confirmed that the pressure gauges and safety pins were in operable range, installed new dated tamper seals, inspected for obstructions, and recorded serial numbers, manufacture dates, and other necessary data. After he was done, the technician installed certification tags on all extinguishers. While on site, the technician also ensured the backup batteries on the emergency lights were in working order. The backup batteries ensure the emergency lights will be operable in case the power goes off. He noted that the backup batteries had to be replaced, which he did. After he was done, he certified that all are now in good working condition.

**Parking Lot Lights** – We received a few reports the last few weeks that the two clubhouse parking lot lights on the south side were not on during the night. Each time, there was an issue with the mechanical time switch. In general, the mechanical time switch is a mechanical dial that turns the lights on/off on a preset time. We readjusted the switch each time, but soon discovered that the tripper that turns the light on failed to do so. Therefore, we had Arctic Air Electric on site to replace the entire mechanical time switch. Arctic Air Electric technician did a nice job and ensured that this should solve this problem.

**FPL Energy Services** – Several residents contacted me recently regarding a letter they received in the mail from

FPL Energy Service. The letter, which some described as scary, talks about protecting residents' water lines because they "could fail without warning." The fact that the name FPL is on it, those residents said, made them feel it was very important and immediate action was warranted. A deeper look into it, one can see a disclosure at the bottom of the letter, which reads:

*"This optional coverage is offered by FPL Energy Services, Inc. (FPLES), Florida license #E099597, and not Florida Power & Light Company (FPL). FPLES is an unregulated subsidiary of FPL. The coverage is administered by HomeServe USA Repair Management (Florida) Corp. ("HomeServe"), Florida License #W220985, with corporate offices located at 601 Merritt 7, 6th Floor, Norwalk, CT 06851. The coverage is provided by ServicePlan of Florida, Inc., Home Warranty Assoc. #70033, 175 West Jackson Blvd., Chicago, IL 60604. FPLES, HomeServe and ServicePlan of Florida, Inc. are each separate and independent companies."*

In other words, this is an unregulated subsidiary of FPL who uses another company to offer insurance coverage for your water line. So you know, this letter is no more than a marketing offer from a private company who wishes to sell its services. In a very brilliant marketing strategy, they use what is known as scare tactics, asking you to act fast in order to avoid a potential risk.

*It is extremely important that you be very wary of such letters and the offers they contain..*

Mainly, you simply may not need these services. Companies like this one hope you get worried so fast that you will act without giving their letter a second thought. However, before you rush to

spend money you must take a moment and look into it. Here are some suggestions when you receive such letters:

- **Research The Company.** Look at consumer protection agencies like the Better Business Bureau for consumer reviews. If there are bad reviews, consumer alert notes or no information at all, you know not to do business with such a company.
- **Research The Offer.** Look into the proposal and see if you really need it.
- **Request More Information.** Ask the company that offers a service to provide you with written materials about their offer and don't forget to ask for references.
- **There Is No Need To Act Fast.** If your water line was not protected for the last 10+ years, it will survive another week or two. Take your time and invest some time in researching.

**Ask For A Second Opinion.** In this case, call your insurance company and see if you are not already covered under your homeowner insurance. Even if not, your insurance agent may provide you with an insight into your need for coverage and may offer you a better rate.

**Lanai Screens** – During the last Landscape Committee Meeting, a discussion took place regarding damaged lanai screens. Mr. Scott Acton, ArtisTree Account Manager and Lawn & Ornamental Director, reported to the committee that on a weekly basis ArtisTree receives at least two requests to repair damaged lanai screens. Allegedly, ArtisTree employees who use weed eaters rip the bottom of those screens. While ArtisTree takes full responsibility in most cases, in others, he argued, the damage is the result of normal wear and tear. You see, as the screen ages it

may become dry rotted which makes the screen very stiff and brittle. This may lead to a rip at the edge of the frame, which is very similar to weed eater damage. The rip is not always noticeable unless one gently pushes on the screen or when the wind blows. Therefore, Mr. Acton asked the committee to acknowledge that in such situations ArtisTree would not assume responsibility. This in mind, we strongly recommend residents to inspect the screens of their front and back lanais. We ask you to do so because many of the lanais in the community are original. We thank you in advance for your cooperation and understanding on this matter.



### **ESTABLISHMENT OF “NEW” FLAG DECORATING COMMITTEE**

On Friday, July 14, The Board of Directors approved establishing a New “Flag Decoration Committee” at the request of the Social Committee. This Committee would not be under the auspices of any existing committees, but initially, would work with the Social Committee regarding procedures previously established for flag decorating on specific Patriotic Holidays, i.e. Presidents’ Day, Memorial Day, July 4, Veterans’ Day. It was the opinion of the Social Committee that, due to the fact that most, if not all, of the above “Patriotic Holidays” usually involve a Social event, it has become increasingly difficult for the Social Committee to work these events, as well as Flag Decorate the Community. We appreciate the help received previously by non-Social Committee residents. We feel that the flag placement on Patriotic Holidays is for the enjoyment of all LRF residents not just those residents who attend Social events on Patriotic Holidays. We hope you consider signing up for this new committee. Specific information will be contained on a signup sheet.





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
