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A message from your Board...

As a community we have had a rather busy year just past, and as we approach the start of another, it's time to take stock in, among other things, where we've been, what succeeded, and how we prepare for the possible reoccurrence of the surprises we encountered along the way.

At the beginning of this previous year, we kicked off the 7 year cycle of repainting of our homes. The project started out of the box with some confusion, but after some slight modification in the color selection, as well as the time frame, the program has progressed rather smoothly. We now have about a quarter of the residences freshly painted, and it is surprising how much nicer a fresh coat of paint makes the neighborhood look. Rolling out this program took a lot of work and creative problem solving by our Architectural Review Board, and as we see the results to date, it appears well worth the effort.

We put in place, this year a revised application process, as well as a Compliance Committee, both of which provide our community with the ability to set and maintain standards in furthering our goals of ensuring resident's safety, and community standards, as envisioned by our operating documents. Again, members stood up and helped implement the new Compliance Committee. They understood the importance of maintaining order and holding our members to the deed restrictions and rules they agreed to when they bought into our community. A tough job, but as they say somebody has to do it. Our thanks again to these volunteers.

We had two visitors, both unwelcome, this past year. One arrived in a 2004 Chevy and created a new temporary entrance thru our western wall. Fortunately, she had insurance and no one was injured. The second visitor was Irma. She arrived via lots of fanfare this fall, but fortunately, after travelling across the Atlantic Ocean

thru the Caribbean, and straight as an arrow up the west coast of Florida, decided at the very last minute to make a loop around rather than thru Sarasota. Again, it doesn't get any better than that. There must be somebody up there looking out for us.

Property Manager's Report

2018 Elections – LakeRidge Falls is happy to announce that the Annual Meeting and Election for Directors will take place on February 1st, 2018 at 7:00 pm and will be held like every year at the **Queen of Martyrs Catholic Church** located at 833 Magellan Drive, Sarasota, FL 34243. In the next few days, you will be receiving the second notice of the Annual Meeting of the membership and election for the Board of Directors. In the envelope, you will see a detailed explanation regarding the meeting and election. *Please read it carefully.*

Committee Signup Sheets – As every year, the committees' signup sheets are available at LakeRidge Falls' Clubhouse. The signup sheets for the Architectural Review Board, Budget & Finance, Buildings, Community Relation, Security, Landscaping, Pool, Roads & Grounds, and Social Committees are available outside Karen's Office. The Board of Directors encourages residents to join the different committees as it provides a feeling of ownership and a great opportunity for you to become active and involved within the community.

Coupon Payment Booklet – You should start receiving your 2018 coupon booklets in the mail. Here are some of the other payment options besides mailing your payment along with the coupon:

1. **Coupon Payment Booklet.** The booklet you received in the mail includes 4 payment stubs. Please make sure to detach the payment stub for the quarter due, write a check for the amount on the stub, fill out the information required on the stub, and mail it to the address as it appears on your booklet.
2. **Drop a check in my office.** You can always drop a check in my office. If for some reason you would not get the booklet by January 1st, simply make sure to write your unit number on the check and make it payable to: Lakeridge Falls Community Association Inc.
3. **Use Your Bank Online Payment Services.** Some banks offer a service which allows clients to pay their bills online. Please contact your bank for more information. Please note that this year there is an increase in the quarterly dues. Therefore, make sure to adjust the amount to avoid late and interest charges.

4. **Join an Automatic Debit Service.** You can request the Association bank to automatically debit your account. The necessary form is available in my office or you can get it by clicking on the following on this [link](#). Please note that the bank would automatically adjust the quarterly dues due. Therefore, homeowners who are enrolled in this program do **NOT** need to contact the bank to advise them on the change.
5. **Pay by Credit Card.** Please note that this service has a convenience fee. If you wish to do so, all you need to do is to click on this [link](#) and follow the instruction.

Bathrooms – In the last few weeks, we had some work done to fix the damages to the clubhouse bathrooms and air conditioning room. First, the Association hired Burke Construction, a general contractor company, to install insulation and dry-wall on the interior walls of the bathrooms, texture those walls, and then paint them to match the current bathrooms colors. They didn't, however, install the wall tile as it is not being manufactured anymore. The goal of that specific repair was to make the bathroom fully functional and somewhat presentable until a more comprehensive plan should be formulated.



A couple of weeks later, Arctic Air Services, the company that installed the current air conditioning units in the Clubhouse, were on site. Arctic Air Services pulled out the two large air handlers from the A/C room allowing a third party vendor to install insulation and drywall on the exterior walls of the bathrooms. In pictures above you can see the empty air conditioning room after the two air handlers were removed and two air handlers

themselves, which were stored in Mrs. Paula Murray's office. If you look closely at the empty air conditioning room, you will see the missing sections of drywall, which were also removed during the mold remediation process. Once the third party vendor was done, Arctic Air Services reinstall the air handlers. With this, we are done with the mold damage repairs until a more comprehensive plan will be designed to bring the bathrooms to their original state.

Clubhouse/Fire Alarm – On a somewhat related issue, the fire alarm monitoring center reported an error in the system indicating an issue with the fire alarm system. The monitoring center indicated that there might be an issue with the backup batteries. Therefore, we called Piper Fire Protection, LakeRidge Falls' fire system service company. Piper technician reported to us that it seemed that someone disconnected one of the backup batteries. Apparently, he theorized, a person who was working in the air conditioning room, which also serves as the fire alarm control panel room, opened the panel where the backup batteries are located. The people, he continued, that performed the mold remediation had to remove the drywall behind that panel and therefore remove the panel off of the wall. The problem, he concluded, that in the process it seems one of the batteries fell out and someone wrongly put it back. Regardless of the above, the technician installed new backup batteries and the system is working without any issues.

ArtisTree / Landscape – Last month, Mr. Scott Acton, ArtisTree Account Manger assigned to LakeRidge Falls, informed us he would be leaving ArtisTree. Therefore, December was his last month serving this community. I am sure many residents will join us in thanking Mr. Acton as there aren't enough words to describe how thankful and grateful we are for all he did. As ArtisTree Lawn & Ornamental Director, he was responsible for reviving and restoring the community lawn following last year's short-fall. He has a significant role in why LakeRidge Falls looks the way it looks today. I am also sure many will join me in wishing Mr. Acton success in his future endeavors.

Pagoda Lights – As many may know, there are 26 pagoda/path lights along the sidewalk that leads from the corner of Cascade Falls Drive and Ashford Falls Court to the community Clubhouse. The last few months, we found ourselves replacing more and more burned out light bulbs in these fixtures. While some may think this is a standard maintenance matter, it is a little bit unique because the burned out bulbs are

LED bulbs. Any person who's gone to a local home improvement store has heard that LED lights, at least in theory, should last for a really long time at least longer than incandescent or fluorescent lights. So, how come our LED bulbs lasted only 5 or so years? Well, in the battle between Mother Nature and LED Technology, Mother Nature is leading 1:0. These fixtures are exposed to the elements 24/7. It is not a surprise, therefore, these bulbs and the fixtures, as a matter of fact, are starting to fail. Last month we had to replace most of the bulbs in the fixtures and replace four fixtures that broke because they dried out. We would like to thank our residents who keep us informed on these matters.

Pool – Last month, Symbiont Services was onsite performing the bi-yearly maintenance on the heating and cooling geo-thermal system. Their certified technician examined the seven pool/spa units and the line going to the lake. Nothing out of the ordinary was found and it was said the system is operating properly and in good condition.


Also last month, we had an unannounced visit from the Florida Department of Health. This unannounced inspection is part of a semi-annual routine check of LakeRidge Falls' pool and spa. During this inspection, the inspector examined the pool and spa areas, the safety and sanitary conditions, the temperature of the spa and pool, the water quality of these two bodies of water, and the equipment area. Following the inspection, the Florida Department of Health inspector informed us she discovered no violations at the time of her inspection. As explained in the past, the Department of Health inspections are important because besides ensuring Smiley Pool Services are performing their job properly, it helps to ensure we are operating based on the updated codes.

Mi Pueblo Gate – We discovered recently that the communication channel to the Mi Pueblo gate was not working. While the gate was working without any issues, we were unable to program new users on the Door King System, the Association gate control system. In more simple terms, we were unable to issue new FOBs to new residents to use this gate. Therefore, we immediately placed a service call with Sunstate Gate, LakeRidge Falls' gate maintenance company. Sunstate technician discovered that the control board was corroded. The technician replaced the board with a new one and tested the system ensuring everything is functioning properly.

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
