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### *A message from your Board...*

November is a time of change and reflection. A time up north when we put the summer tools in the back of the garage and brought the snow blower out, then checked to see if it needed work before the first flakes appeared. We finalized our preparation for getting things ready for a time of bringing many outdoor activities to a conclusion and indoor activities to the fore. Here in Florida, we tend to do things in reverse. After a long hot summer that limits our outdoor activities, we look forward to the cooler temperatures and the opportunities that it affords us to spend more time outdoors. The Bocce courts in the community are again being used, the residents that don't own dogs are again out and walking around as midday approaches. Our snowbird neighbors start to return to enjoy our weather with us. It's the cycle, the pattern of activity we have become accustomed to. It's also traditionally a time of reflection, a time as the year starts, to wind down as we begin to assess what we have accomplished, where we are and where we are going. Nationally, we celebrate this mood of reflection in the form of two holidays: Veterans Day and Thanksgiving. More on those in a minute.

In this mode, I started thinking about, or reflecting on, what, as a community, had we accomplished in the past year or at least started to work on, or even start a conversation about in the past year. I started by thinking about the 27 households of new residents we attracted this past 12 months, what tipped their decision to move here as opposed to some other development. I thought about the fact that very few units remain on the market for any period of time. I thought of the people that live here, who I stop my bike and talk to on a daily basis, what keeps them here, what they think are our successes and what they want for themselves and our community.

Continuing in this reflective mode, I started to think about what issues we are currently working on as a community. Our reevaluation of the sidewalks comes to mind. The suggestion that we think of them as a community amenity, a ribbon connecting us as neighbors, seems to have softened the reality of the inevitable expense to keep them flat and safe. Recently, at a resident's suggestion, we started a conversation about concerns over Corporate investor interest in our community and we workshopped the available remedies and support for the issue. We introduced a budget at our October meeting that realistically reflects a reserve study to keep the community on course for the next ten years, barring a natural catastrophe such as a hurricane. This budget proposal took the Budget committee the spring



## Property Manager's Report

**Sod** –As some may know, the Landscape Committee meets on a monthly basis to discuss matters related to the maintenance, enhancement, and long term plans for LakeRidge Falls' landscaping. As part of its duty the committee reviews, again on a monthly basis, the performance of Bright View, LakeRidge Falls Landscape Company, using a measurable tool called the Monthly Evaluation Form. This tool helps the committee to identify where and when Bright View falls short of community expectations. It also helps the committee to monitor the progress made by Bright View in improving any issues identified. This in mind, it is not a secret that we are experiencing major issues with the turf as evidenced by the less than satisfactory condition of the sod community wide. The main problems, as identified by Bright View, are fungus and chinch bugs. For the last year, the Landscape Committee has been conducting an open and close dialogue with Bright View regarding the condition of the turf and ways to solve these two matters and improve the appearance of the turf. To make a very long story short, the bottom line is that Bright View has failed to meet the community expectations on the condition of the turf and failed to improve on this matter.

Regardless, both the committee and the Board of Directors are working vigorously to find ways to solve this situation including the possibility of going with a different vendor. In regards to the latest statement, there are no guarantees that going with a different vendor will produce better results. After all, Bright View is one of the best and biggest companies in the area and a company the community has had a great working relationship for the last decade. Nevertheless, we have communicated to Bright View that the community expects an immediate turnaround on the condition and appearance of the turf and provided a deadline for meeting such expectations. So please know that the condition of the turf is our number one priority and all options are on the table. We hope a visible solution to this unpleasant problem is just around the corner and in the meantime we appreciate your patience on this matter.

**Crime Prevention Deputy Visit** – As advertised in the Weekly Reminder, this week we had Deputy Russ Younger from the Manatee County Sheriff Office on site. Deputy Younger, who is the community liaison to the Sheriff Office and a Crime Prevention Deputy, provided a presentation on a variety of topics and shared some great guidance regarding personal safety and property security. In addition, he dedicated a significant part of his

presentation on how to avoid becoming a scam victim and shared some examples of scam plots circling our areas. He also handed out reading material on these issues and other literature regarding ways to handle unfortunate situations in which one becomes a victim of a scam.

During the Q & A section of his presentation, we brought up the issue of the emergency clickers. For those who may not know, emergency clickers are clickers which are used by first responders throughout Manatee County to enter any gate in the case of an emergency. For example, if an ambulance is called to a house in our community, the ambulance driver does not need to go through the front gate because he or she can enter through any gate in the community using this clicker. This way valuable time is saved as the emergency responder can reach the destination faster.

The reason this issue was brought up is because it seems such clickers found their way to individuals who are not first responders. In recent years, the use of such clickers became so widely spread that it is very common for us to see how Parcel Shipment Companies, Manatee County, Small Vendors, and much more use such clickers to enter through the Resident Only Gate off of the Lockwood Ridge entrance. Deputy Younger didn't have a lot to offer on the issue because, as we have learned, the Sheriff Office does not regulate the use of such clickers nor have the tools to enforce their usages (i.e. there are no laws against it). However, the discussion that evolved from this topic lead to the realization that their use to begin with was a decision that was made by a public appointed official. Therefore, it was suggested by someone that residents contact Manatee County Commissioner, Mrs. Vanessa Baugh, and ask for help on this matter. After all, Sarasota County uses another emergency access control system that does not involve a clicker that can be duplicated.

Therefore, we encourage residents to contact Commissioner Baugh regarding the security problems that the emergency clickers are causing the community and demand this system be changed. After all, it is in everyone's best interest. Below is the contact information for Commissioner Baugh's office:

**Back Gate Incidence** – Staying on the same topic, we received a report recently from one of the officers at the Gatehouse stating he witnessed an unauthorized white SUV forcing its way through the back residents' only gate off of Lockwood Ridge Rd. As a result, he continued, one of the arm gates broke. Following the report, we pulled the footage from the incident and witnessed firsthand what happened. Taking action on the matter, the Board of Directors decided to file a criminal complaint against the vehicle owner for trespassing and damages. A complaint was filed with Manatee County Sheriff and demand for payment was made to that owner vehicle. We hope Association reactions to such unpleasant incidents will prevent them from it happening again.

**Gates** – Recently, we discovered that we were unable to electronically communicate with a couple of the gates. As a result we could not add new users or remove old ones from our system. Although this issue didn't affect the day to day operation of those gates or current residents' accessibility, we had to make sure this issue is fixed. Therefore, we placed a call with Bright House Business Solutions, LakeRidge Falls' internet and phone provider. After a quick inspection of the two matters on hand, a Bright House's technician determined that in one gate the modem burned due to a lighting strike while on the other gate the wiring was old and had to be replaced. Following the diagnostics, the issues were fixed and communication to the gates was restored.

**Unified Vision 20/25** – Last month, LakeRidge Falls Community Association held a community workshop event at the Palm Aire Country Club. The event was a great success with about 200 attendees. At the event, two architects and two designers offered their proposed improvements to the community amenities. Residents who attended the event were asked to fill out a survey to select the individuals or the firms that they think thought understood the needs of the LakeRidge Falls residents and that they thought would work well with the community as a whole. In this survey, residents were also asked to provide any additional comments they had.

Following the meeting, renderings of the architects and designers are now being presented in the clubhouse. In addition and based on residents' feedbacks, the full presentations by the two architects, Mr. Timothy Del Vescovo and Mr. Cliff Scholz, are now available online on LakeRidge Falls' website under the Tab Form. We hope you find this information helpful.

**Pool Furniture Cleaning** – Recently, we unintentionally scheduled a routine pool furniture cleaning job during a pool activity. The group who was scheduled to use the pool argued they were unable to continue with their program at the same time the vendor was cleaning the furniture. Therefore, they had to cancel their activity. To avoid future issues such as this one, we asked the Pool Committee to advise the Board of Directors on when to close the pool, preferably on known intervals, so the pool furniture can be cleaned. This way, residents will be aware in advance when the pool is scheduled to be serviced prior to making any plans. Following a recommendation made by the Pool Committee, we would like to announce that the pool will be closed for an hour between the hours of 8am and 9am on the first Wednesday of every other month starting November 2<sup>nd</sup>. This way, we will be able

to insure all pool furniture is clean without conflicting with residents' enjoyment of the pool. We would like to thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation on this matter.

**Pool Hours** – It was brought to our attention recently that there are some residents who are using the pool before dawn. For those who may not know, the pool hours are from dawn until dusk. The pool is also open to all residents and their guests at their own risk and in accordance with the regulations of the State of Florida, Manatee County and the Lakeridge Falls Association. If some residents fail to follow this simple rule and disregard those guidelines, the Association will have no other choice but to take measures of enforcement to ensure the safety of its residents. Please, enforcement is the last resort we will like to use, but if forced to do so letters will be sent and FOBs will be disconnected. We ask that you please understand this and as before thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation on this matter.

**Fitness Center** – Recently, we were informed that one of the treadmills was not working right. Following the report, we made sure to unplug the treadmill, post an "out of order" sign on it, and place a service call for those two issues. It took longer than we hoped for, but Fitness Logic, LakeRidge Falls' fitness center maintenance company, eventually came on site to investigate the matters. They discovered that the drive motor on the treadmill was broken and needed to be replaced. While they were on site, they made sure to perform routine quarterly maintenance work. Following the maintenance work, they suggested as preemptive maintenance, to replace a ramp wheel on one of the ellipticals and replace a clutch assembly on one of the recumbent bikes. Following their suggestions, a work order was placed to address these issues. A couple of weeks passed and Fitness Logic was one again on site performing such those repairs. Due to the fact that the treadmill and recumbent bike are still under warranty, the Association was able to save hundreds of dollars in parts and shipment costs and was responsible only for the couple of hundred dollars in labor costs.

The ARB presented a New Color Scheme for Lakeridge Falls to begin with the community wide exterior painting requirement that will begin 2017 and be phased in every six months through 2018. The ARB committee has been working with an exterior paint designer who works with new and older developments. Adele Lepow, Chairperson of the ARB and Mary Cochran, introduced the color schemes provided for all neighborhoods at our LRF Board meeting in October with a brief explanation of how the choices for the body, trim and doors are coordinated as well as how the ARB requests will be handled. There will be two Paint Color workshops to further answer your questions about colors selection, requests and guidelines. They will be on November 17th and 19th at 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. We are excited to offer these choices to our residents and feel they will give our community an upscale lift.
