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A message from your Board...

January is normally thought of as the First, or lead off month of the year, but here at Lakeridge Falls, it's actually the final month of our yearly governance cycle. We had a busy 2017 and capped that with an interesting January, 2018. First off, we had a meet and greet Candidate's afternoon on the 11th. As you should be aware, we have a competitive election for the three seats on our Board of Directors this cycle. Fortunately, we continue to have community members step forward to volunteer for these positions on our Board. We also had, for the first time, three incumbents seek re-election to the Board. Many thanks again to our Nominating committee, composed of former Board members, who stepped forward to organize as well as officiate at that event. Volunteers again, at every level, make this community click for pretty much everything that happens here in Lakeridge Falls. We videotaped the 75 minute session, so if you have an interest in what's going on in the community, please click on, and by all means, please remember to return your proxy or bring your ballot to the annual meeting at Our Lady Queen of Martyr's church on Thurs. February 1st.

At our January 12th Board Meeting, we approved a letter to be sent to our County Officials, that advises them we are taking action on the emergency, or universal, gate clickers. We believe that the current misuse of these clickers is seriously impacting on our collective safety as well as community security. By this letter, we are notifying the County Administration, that since they have failed to properly manage control of these clickers that, on the advice of our Legal Counsel, we will be disabling the use of these clickers and that all emergency vehicles, as well as anyone else with a non-community clicker, will no longer be able to

access our residents only rear gate after March 1st. Recall, that these clickers are being used routinely by service and delivery people as well. We anticipate, as we cut off this access in early March, that we can expect some confusion by our regular violators such as UPS, Air Conditioning vendors and even some county employees, who are accustomed to using these devices for their convenience in gaining unauthorized access to our community. Please, do not help these people improperly access our community. If you are approached at the rear gate, please let these people know we expect all nonresidents to enter our community by way of the gate house entrance off Tuttle Ave. It should be interesting to see what happens. We will keep you informed via Oded's weekly reports and Paula's weekly reminders as well as an article in this column.

Finally this month, on a personal note: I have now written 24 of these From Your Board articles: where does the time go? I've enjoyed writing these monthly articles and hope they have been both informative and interesting to the membership. Property Manager's Report

Back Gate Emergency Access – Per Manatee County Ordinance, all gated communities in Manatee County must have a specific access control system **in addition** to the community's own access control system. The county required system is designed to allow emergency services access to all of the gated communities in Manatee County. This way, emergency service vehicles can enter any community when they need without any delays. In order to gain access, all emergency services in Manatee County were provided with a clicker that many came to refer to as an **emergency clicker**.

A problem started a few years ago. Through resident reports and footage from the security cameras, we notice non-emergency public vehicles, mainly Manatee County employees, and commercial vehicles, such as FedEx and UPS, gaining access to LakeRidge Falls via the Residents Only Gate off Lockwood Ridge Road using those emergency clickers. In order to solve this issue, we attempt to intercept each one of these trespassers asking them to register with the gatehouse. In addition, we sent warning letters to the companies that we are able to identify. However, these measures are ineffective in solving the issue.

Therefore, a delegation of the LakeRidge Falls' Board of Directors met with County Commissioner Vanessa Baugh and County Administrator Edwin Hunzeker last year. The delegation explained the problem and asked that the code that controls the emergency access system be changed at least bi-annually to minimize the problem. The officials promised to look into the issue. However, a year passed and we continue to daily witness Manatee County employees, delivery trucks, waste management vehicles, plumbing companies, cable companies, private cars, and many more going to who knows where using the clickers to access the community's resident only gate. Apparently, this emergency clicker became an open secret.

As one can imagine, the Board of Directors is displeased with this situation. After all, the association spends over \$150,000 per year to have the entrance staffed 24 hours a day in order to increase the security of its residents. Therefore, the Board decided to act following the County's refusal to timely correct the problem.

The Board sought the advice of its attorney who argued that the Association must act in order to ensure the safety and security of its residents. Therefore, the Board approved during its last meeting a letter that was sent to Manatee County advising that LakeRidge Falls is left with no other choice but to deactivate the emergency access system at the back gate effective March 1st. That said, this will not affect residents' ability to enter the back gate. The hope is that this will help reduce the problem while encouraging the county to act on the matter.

Back Gate – On a related issue, we were notified last month that one of the back exit gates leading to Lockwood Ridge Rd was stuck open. Following the reports, Sunstate Gate, LakeRidge Falls gate maintenance company, was called on site. After inspection, Sunstate Gate technician discovered that the arm that pulls the gate open was broken. Therefore, he removed the arm and took it with him to their shop. In the meantime, the gate was closed for a couple of days. Last Friday, two Sunstate Gate technicians were on site to reinstall the repaired arm and the gate is now working with no other issues.

Gatehouse Phone – A few weeks back, we were experiencing some issues with the gatehouse phone system. For this reason, residents were unable to reach the gatehouse over the phone in order to register their guests. After speaking with their customer service, Spectrum, LakeRidge Falls phone, internet, and cable provider, advised we had an issue with the modem. Luckily enough, they were able to send a technician later in the day to solve the issue. That said, we realized during this unpleasant experience that some residents are unaware that the gatehouse has an email address. Therefore, please be advised that the email address for our wonderful team of guards is Security@LakeRidgeFalls.Org.

Waterfall – As you may have noticed, we had some issues in recent weeks with the lights at the waterfall. At first, Smiley Pool Services, LakeRidge Falls' pool and waterfall maintenance company, thought the issue was with a defaulted timer. However, they soon learned that the issue was more complex. Apparently, some of the electrical wires at the waterfall control box were damaged. After all, this control box, although covered, is still out in the open facing all the humidity Florida has to offer. Regardless, Smiley used a licensed electrician to re-wire the wires that control the waterfall lights timer and everything is said to be working without issue.

Palm Tree – Many people who drove from or towards Tuttle Ave may have noticed the Association had a foxtail palm in the center of the flower bed located just off Tuttle Ave. This palm was planted years ago by the former landscape company with hopes it would be the marker for those who were looking for the entrance to the community. Years passed by and the palm started to struggle until it completely died this week. Here are the three main reasons for that.

First, the palm was actually a multi-trunk foxtail palm. However, someone decided to trim two of its trunks before it was planted. Whatever the reason for it, its chances to flourish were not high to

begin with. Another issue was the Ganoderma problem. As we reported in the past, Ganoderma is a fungus, which infects the bottom of palm trees eventually leading to their decline. A few years back, the Association had to remove most of the palms in that area and redesign the front landscape beds because the soil is infected with this fungus. Of course, this condition didn't help. Finally, ArtisTree reported that the landscape bed where the palm was located has a significant layer of clay soil, which does not provide the best earth environment for spreading palm roots.

Considering all of the above, the palm never had a real chance to make it for the long run. Therefore, we had no choice but to remove it. However, good came out of this matter. The good thing is that those driving towards Tuttle Ave will no longer have to struggle to see the oncoming traffic on their left as they attempt to turn right. At the end of the day, while we lost a tree we gain safety.

Fraud Alert – Recently, one of the residents advised me that he was targeted by PayPal spammers. The resident who brought this matter to our attention reported the following: “I encountered an official looking email that came from “PayPal”. I opened the email that required a password. It was immediately noticed that it asked to confirm a credit card number by entering the complete number. It then requested a social security number ‘as it appears on tax form’. At this point the email was closed and deleted.”

As explained in the past, spammers all the time try to email, and sometimes even call, you for the purpose of tricking you into giving out your personal information using email, text, or pop-up messages that ask for your personal or financial information. Therefore, make sure **NOT** to click on links sent to you via text messages or emails even if the message seems to be from an organization you trust. If you receive a follow-up call, make sure **NOT** to provide any information and instead end the conversation and call back the institute using the numbers you get from its

official website. Remember, a legitimate business will never ask you to send sensitive information through insecure channels.

Here are some more tips provided by The Federal Trade Commission to avoid similar fraud attempts:

- Use trusted security software and set it to update automatically.
- Don't email personal or financial information. Email is not a secure method of transmitting personal information.
- Only provide personal or financial information through an organization's website if you typed in the web address yourself and you see signals that the site is secure, like a URL that begins https (the "s" stands for secure). Unfortunately, no indicator is foolproof; some phishers have forged security icons.
- Review credit card and bank account statements as soon as you receive them to check for unauthorized charges. If your statement is late by more than a couple of days, call to confirm your billing address and account balances.
- Be cautious about opening attachments and downloading files from emails, regardless of who sent them. These files can contain viruses or other malware that can weaken your computer's security.

We hope you will find this information useful and wish to thank, as always, residents who share their experiences with us so all will learn from.

Fitness Center – Last month, three of the stations on the Hoist Multi Station machine located in the Fitness Center were temporarily out of service. The reason was maintenance. During one of its maintenance visits, Fitness Logic, LakeRidge Falls' fitness center maintenance

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company, suggested to replace the pads and reupholster the seats and backs on these stations because they were starting to tear apart. Following this suggestion, the Building Committee reviewed the matter and decided to recommend to the Board of Directors to perform this job. The Board reviewed the recommendation and approved the work. Following the approval, Fitness Logic took the seats and backs to their shop, replaced the old pads with new ones, and reupholstered all. They did a good job and the Hoist Multi Station is now fully functional.

On a related matter, every now and then we notice equipment being moved around in the Fitness Center. The video footage revealed that in the vast majority of the times the users who have done this are residents' guests. Whatever the reasons for their actions are, this is unacceptable for two main reasons: 1) they may injure themselves in the process; 2) they may damage the equipment in the process, which may lead to unnecessary expenses and jeopardize the usage of the equipment by others. Therefore, please advise your guests that they are not allowed to move the fitness equipment. If this continues, we will have no other choice but to start enforcement procedures against these owners whose guests are moving the fitness center equipment. Thank you in advance for your cooperation on this matter.

Residents Directory - Please note that we are in the process of updating our records. We are asking owners who wish to add or update their emails or any other piece of information, to please fill out a new Residents Directory and Mass Email Distribution Information Form, which can be found online or at the Clubhouse, outside my office. After obtaining the form and filling it out, please return the form back to the Lakeridge Falls Office. This form will take no more than five minutes to complete but will provide us with the ability to better communicate with our residents. Please make sure to fill out the form by clearly printing your information. After you are done, please make sure to sign the form and mail, email, or fax it back to us so we may update our records. Thank you in advance for your immediate attention and cooperation.

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
