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A message from your Board...

Our Board of Directors are moving forward into a new phase to shape our Community for the future. The newly approved committees have been working hard to begin the tasks that the majority of the residents agreed would be most beneficial in the short and long-term plans for Lakeridge Falls.

At the March 9th Board Meeting, we approved to add four additional committee volunteers to various committees. This is a positive testament of our residents' commitment to assist their fellow neighbors. Several of our seasonal residents were eager to make "time and sweat investment" and improved the Bocce courts.

Moreover, there was evidence within the Community Relations Committee that they obtained advertising and recruited advertisers to offset the cost of printing and mailing our 2018 Directory which will be available soon. The Social Committee and Art League provided events for the residents with entertainment and fun. There was a new and clear protocol approved to follow for gatherings at our Clubhouse. There was a motion approved to cover additional installation cost of the final lighting fixtures and wiring for the path lights in front of the Clubhouse. review of final cost estimates, the Board approved to accept Mr. James Dickason to provide architectural services design plans to LakeRidge Falls for the amenities area. Last, but not least, there was a proposal made and approved for the security camera system to be added at our North Emergency Only gate. There was further discussion of an additional contractor to re-surface our pool. As you can see, the Board is very active in implementing projects for the safety, security and enjoyment for our all residents.

Our neighborhoods are beginning to look fresh and new with the painting of area homes and maintenance of screens and lanais. Most of the painters are trying to paint the homes as they are phased into the Guidelines. The ARB reports that many residents are planning improvements and maintenance which will enhance their homes. This is all good news and it will help to keep our property values high and our future bright. We all must be patient with the added traffic and added noise that the projects bring with them. I'd like to remind everyone to respect the speed limits and practice being "part of the solution instead of the problem."

The Board approved a garage sale during the month of April. This would be a good time to clean out your storage closets and garages. One person's trash might be another person's treasure! Again, let's try to be good neighbors for this half day event. I am sure they could still use some volunteers!

I would like to remind those who frequent the Clubhouse that the Medical Emergency Box or Defibrillator is for Emergency reasons only. When the door is opened, it automatically dispatches an ambulance. If you set off the alarm and it is a false alarm, LRF would be charged for the dispatched ambulance whether it was by accident or not.

Property Manager's Report

Clubhouse Roof Maintenance – We discovered last month a few water stains on the ceiling in the hallway and in the Association Assistant office. Following this, we placed a service call with Manasota Roofing, a local licensed and insured roofing company. Mr. Mike Hartigan, co-owner of Manasota Roofing, immediately determined this was a result of a water leak coming from one of the roof's vents. As can be seen in the pictures below, water penetrated through a crack around the roof's vent each time it rained and from there it dripped down under the roof's tiles. As time went by, the roofing tar was damaged by the water. For those who may not know and in general terms the tar is the durable and waterproof layer under the tiles that actually protects the roof from water. Therefore, Manasota Roofing employee pulled out the tiles along what he believed to be the water path coming down the vent, reapplied protective tar, and reinstalled the tiles.

Clubhouse Carpet Maintenance - Staying in the Clubhouse area, MDS Carpet and Tile Cleaning was on site today cleaning and scotch-guarding the carpets in the Fitness Center, Grand Salon, and Computer Room. We ask that you please help us keep the Clubhouse and Fitness Center clean by handling food and drink with care. If you spill something, please make sure to clean it up. If you are unable to do so, please inform us of the issue and location and we will make sure this area will be treated by our cleaning company, Sonshine Cleaning, during one of the days they are on site. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and understanding on this matter.

Clubhouse Flag Maintenance – Also recently, we noticed that both the rope and hooks used to proudly display the American Flag in the Clubhouse are deteriorating. For this reason, we ordered a couple of new heavy duty swivel hook snaps and a heavy duty double braid polyester bull rope. This week and with the help of Mr. Matt Stewart, ArtisTree Account Manager, I had the honor to replace the rope and hooks on the Association flag pole.

New Path/Pagoda Lights – During its December of last year’s meeting, the Board of Directors approved the installation of path/pagoda lights along the front Clubhouse sidewalks. This issue was first brought up by several groups that use the Clubhouse at night such as the Social Committee and Bingo who argued that the path from the front exit to the parking lot is dark. When we examined the issue, it was clear the reports were valid as the parking lot lights do not provide sufficient coverage for this area. Following on it, the Association collected a couple of bids and eventually awarded the job to Whitson Electric Services. Although the task seems pretty straightforward and simple, it required careful planning such as understanding underground infrastructure and electric capacity. We are happy to say that the job was completed last month. Eleven 4-tier green pagoda lights and posts were installed, which match the same ones the Association has at the back of the Clubhouse leading to Cascade Falls Drive. We are sure all would agree that besides the added safety value of the pagoda lights they also add a nice aesthetic value to the Clubhouse.

Annex Building Maintenance – In the past year, it seems that if something goes wrong it will only go wrong during the weekend, aka car in the lake. During one of the weekends, I got a report that one of the toilets in the pool ladies bathroom was constantly running. Following up on the report and in my absence, Mrs. Mary Cochran, LakeRidge Falls’ President, and Mr. John Sullivan, LakeRidge Falls’ Treasurer, inspected the bathroom. They noticed that water was coming from the toilet shutoff valve. Therefore, they turned off the shutoff water valve. Although they tightened the valve as much as possible, a small continuous leak continued to come out. Following their action, we placed a service call with the Plumbing Dept of Arctic Air Services. Following the call, a plumber came early Monday morning and replaced the defective stop valve and just in case also the toilet’s flush valve and supply line. All toilets are said to be working with no issue...until Murphy (i.e. Murphy Law) will come and visit us during one of the upcoming weekends.

Kids at the Pool – Several complaints were submitted with us stating that visiting children were making too much noise at the pool area and that some of them who were under the age of 16 years were using the spa without supervision. LakeRidge Falls’ Pool and Spa Rules are very clear. The Pool Rules states that “Excessive noise should be avoided.” The Spa Rules on the other hand states that “Children under sixteen must have adult supervision and parental permission.” While some may not like them, these rules were established for the benefit of all in mind. The first rule mentioned above takes into consideration the fact that LakeRidge Falls has a relaxed 55+ community environment. The second rule was established to ensure the safety and health of guests. We kindly ask you to please ensure your guests follow the rules and regulations governing the Association in general and the pool and spa in particular. Please help us keep the pool area enjoyable and safe for all.

Waterfall – During a routine inspection, we discovered what seems to be a major leak from the waterfall. Reason being that there was a significant gap under the south side of the structure, as can be seen in the picture below, and a path of collapsed ground all the way to the lake. In the lake we discovered evidence of a washout. The following day, we conducted an intensive investigation into the matter by the vendors that operate the waterfall, Smiley Pool, Systematic, and Hall Fountains, and the area around the waterfall, ArtisTree.



To make a really long story short, we discovered that an old irrigation line located close to the structure was leaking from a coupling. The leak was underground and was hard to locate. The reason why we thought the waterfall was the source of the major leak was because in the gap under the south side of the waterfall we saw water leaking from the structure. The leak became intense each time the waterfall was on and decreased when it was turned off. We later discovered that cracks in the waterfall basin are the source of this condition. The bad news is that we now know for sure the waterfall must be resurfaced sooner rather than later. On the other hand, the good news is the solution to the problem was simple and inexpensive. The better news is that the waterfall is up and running again.

Alligator – Good News! Mr. Kevin Hibler, a certified and licensed nuisance alligator trapper, notified me that he was successful in capturing the alligator, which was residing in the community since September of last year... or at least we hope so (i.e. it is the original alligator that was spotted). Mr. Hibler reported that the alligator measured 5 feet and 1 inch, which is 6 inches shorter than the first and only time an alligator was captured in LakeRidge Falls in 2012. Below is a picture of the alligator as was taken moments after it was caught.



Irrigation Meter Accuracy Tests – A few weeks back, we received a reminder notice from Southwest Florida Water Management District, better known as SWFWMD, that both of our irrigation water meters are due for meter accuracy testing. SWFWMD explains that the meter accuracy testing, which is performed every five years, “is an essential part of any water audit. The results of a water audit are valid only if the figures used, which come from the metering data, are accurate.” In other words, SWFWMD directed the Association to verify that the irrigation water meters are calibrated thus insuring accurate readings of usage.

Therefore, Systematic Services, LakeRidge Falls’ irrigation pump maintenance company, performed these tests last month. The way a meter accuracy test is conducted is by digging a few feet near the water meter itself, revealing the main pipe that “feeds” this meter, and then mount testing equipment to the pipe to read the water flow. For those who wondered why there was a big hole barricaded with caution near the irrigation station located next to the Clubhouse parking lot, now you know. When the tests were completed, Systematic informed us that we passed the tests and both water meters are accurate in their reading. We, in return, submitted the required paperwork to SWFWMD.



2017 Financial Audit – We are happy to announce that the 2017 Audit of the LakeRidge Falls’ financials have been completed and copies will be available in my office starting next week. If you wish, an electronic version of the audit is also available and I am more than happy to email you a PDF copy upon request. As in the last few years, the audit was performed by Braxton & Holway, P.A. , a reputable CPA firm located in Bradenton. It is important to note that Braxton & Holway is a member of both the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and of the Florida Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Also as in the past, Braxton & Holway assigned Mr. Stuart Histon, a Certified Public Accountant, to conduct the LakeRidge Falls’ audit. In their opinion section of the report, Braxton & Holway concluded that to their opinion “the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Lakeridge Falls Community Association, Inc. as of December 31, 2017, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.”

AUTHORS' CORNER - April 2018 Update

In late 2008, shortly after Dick and I moved here from New Jersey, I'd been approached about starting an "Authors' Group". At that time, four interested LRF "resident authors" expressed interest: Bob Hollister, Bob Brownstein, Ken Shields and myself. Several years later Bob Brownstein passed away: shortly thereafter, Ken and Bob moved out from LRF. One 'remaining' author cannot constitute an *Authors' Corner*. We frequently met and probably, held at least 2 book signing events, one of which was associated with the Holiday boutique, sponsored by The Art League. We hosted an LRF community event with speaker, H. Terrell Griffin, whom I met at the 2008 Mystery Writers of Florida conference, in Sarasota. The event was well attended by residents.
