A message from your Board...

It's been nearly a year since the LakeRidge Falls entry feature, the waterfall, had to be turned off due to mechanical issues. If you happened to enter our community using the main entrance in mid-June, you were treated to a refreshing sight, the falls in full operation, truly a welcoming sight.

July is the time when our Budget Committee starts to meet to put together the budget for 2022. With this in mind, committees are reviewing expenditures from the present year, and considering changes for next year. The budget committee will be hard at work through October, at which time they will present the Board with a 2022 plan covering income and expenditures as well as changes to reserves. As in the past, all residents will be invited to attend a budget workshop, at which time the committee will review their proposed plan to the association.

Speaking of committees, many are hard at work all summer dealing with issues of concern to residents. The committees are again meeting in the clubhouse and also streaming to anyone wishing to observe and comment.

At the June Board meeting, we approved a policy to hopefully solve the issue of



landscape contractors slicing lanai screens as they cut the grass. We provided a few options including mulch and pavers, which the ARB has approved. In September, the landscape vendor will be directed to cut the grass no closer than 12" from lanai screens. Our community manager will check into finding a person or persons to help those who cannot or do not wish to clear this narrow strip of grass. We hope to provide contacts in the near future. I wish to thank the committee members in various committees who helped formulate this new policy.

For some time, we have discussed a resident only, password protected section to our community website. In the coming months, we hope to have such a section available, to include board and committee minutes, financial data, and an up-to-date resident directory. There are many details to work through, but our new community assistant and committee member are willing to help us accomplish this, as well as updating the general site.

If you are here at LakeRidge Falls, enjoy our Florida summer, the fully opened gym, card rooms, the pool with the new pool furniture, and the welcoming waterfall. And please stay safe!

Pool Furniture – Back in late 2018, the Pool Committee started playing with the idea of replacing the aging pool patio furniture. The topic came about right after the pool was resurfaced and while the Association was in the mix of the amenity center’s renovation. After all, as some argued, the old pool furniture was an eyesore in comparison to the brand new and modern-looking pool. Since then, the members of the various Pool Committees, i.e. members change each year, worked on an action plan for purchasing new pool furniture. Acting within reasonable financial boundaries, the Board of Directors started the implementation of the plan last year with the purchase of five brand new pool umbrellas. In March of this year, the Board of Directors approved, following thorough and detailed research work by the Pool Committee, the purchase of 25 chaise lounge chairs, 35 regular chairs, and 4 trash bin receptacles. We are happy to announce that the furniture was delivered by Florida Patio Furniture, a local company.



Finally, the Board of Directors approved during one of its meetings yet another recommendation by the Pool Committee which asked to accelerate collection in the 2022 budget to refinish the five 48" tables and in the 2023 budget to purchase twelve 20" punch-top tables. We wish to thank all the members and residents who were involved through the years with this endeavor and invite all to enjoy LakeRidge Falls’ amazing pool.

Pool– On a related matter, it was written several times in the past how the Association’s pool/spa is such a desirable amenity that even Murphy, you know, the fellow from Murphy’s Law, likes to come and visit it every so often. So, he just came again. A few weeks ago, and while on vacation, I was notified that the spa was not working. Following an inspection of the incident, Smiley Pool Services, the Association's pool/spa maintenance company, determined the issue was a faulty timer, which is used to control the length of time the spa should run. It took Smiley Pool Services a couple of days to replace the faulty component, during which the spa was closed, but at the end of the day, the timer was replaced, and the spa is up and running again.

A couple of weeks later, we had a visit by the Dept. of Health. If you follow the Weekly Reports, and if not, there is a test next week, you surely remember that the Dept. of Health performs each year two routine checks of LakeRidge Falls’ pool and spa. In 95% of all cases, we pass the inspection with flying colors. This time around and unfortunately, the inspector notified us that the pH level at the spa was a little bit high. One of the main duties of any pool/spa maintenance company is to maintain a proper chemical balance in these bodies of water. This is mainly to ensure the water is clean and to protect the pool/spa equipment and surface. The most important element in chemical balancing the pool/spa is to ensure a proper

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pH level. Low pH levels mean eye and skin irritation because the water is too acidic. High pH means the water is too cloudy. There is of course more to it than my simple and general explanation, but the general idea is that high pH during a Dept of Health inspection means the spa had to be closed until the proper balance could be reached.

Minutes after closing the spa, i.e. the pool remained opened, the inspector called both Smiley Pool Services and myself informing us of the finding and action. Smiley Pool Services tech came on-site within a couple of hours. Upon inspection, the tech concluded that the issue was the ORP. The ORP, or Oxidation-Reduction Potential in its full and headache-causing name, is a device that electronically monitors the chemical levels of the spa thus ensuring continuous and flawless water chemistry levels. The problem with the ORP was that it had to be calibrated because it was feeding chlorine too fast and/or acid too slow and therefore the pH was higher than warranted. Nevertheless, Smiley Pool Services took care of the issue and the spa was reopened within a few hours.

The more important issue that came out of the Dept of Health visit was that the inspector noticed some noise coming from the pool pump. Therefore, it was recommended it be looked at as it was an indication that the 10-year-old motor/pump is reaching its useful life. Smiley Pool Services wasted no time and attempted to locate a replacement. However, they soon discovered that this specially sized motor/pump, i.e. 7.5 HP, is not something many suppliers keep in stock. More alarming was the fact that

many industries are battling shortages at the moment which means a new pump can't be manufactured and/or delivered in less than four or so weeks.

Then, the infamous Murphy struck again. A week passed and the noises got louder and louder. With residents' safety in mind and to avoid further damage to the pipes, the Board of Directors directed to turn the pool pump off. As a result, we had to close the pool per the Dept. of Health regulations. However, Murphy can't and will never stop us. For the next couple of days that followed, we reached out to several vendors and suppliers in an attempt to locate a replacement motor/pump. Thinking outside the box, we reached out to Water Equipment Technologies (WET), a local pump maintenance company, which the Association recently hired to replace the waterfall's pump based on the recommendation of the Roads & Grounds Committee. While WET main line of work does not involve pool pumps, we had a bingo.

Unable to locate the entire pump, WET was able to retrofit the motor. Thereafter, a couple of WET technicians came on-site and reinstalled the motor making sure all was working up to par. Thankfully, an issue that could have taken weeks to address was solved in less than 4 days. While we have no control over this unfortunate chain of events, we appreciate your understanding of this matter.

Backflows – By the time you read this newsletter, you should have received a notice from Manatee County requiring you to test your backflows within 30 days. Some will start receiving these notices in the next few days. If you don't hear from us, please ignore the letter.

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The reason why is because the Association contracts, as it does each year, with a certified and licensed plumbing company to perform this task for you. The company that was hired to perform this work is The WaterWorks, which should have concluded this project by late June.

A few things one must consider while The WaterWorks going through this process:

- The WaterWorks submits the proper forms with Manatee County on behalf of LakeRidge Falls' homeowners ensuring the proper certification process was completed.
- The WaterWorks installs a tag on each backflow when done. The tag indicates the month the certification took place and more importantly that your backflow has passed the certification test. It also serves as an advertising tool used by most plumbing companies to help residents locate their contact information in case an issue ever arises with the backflow.
- If you receive a notice that your backflow didn't pass, please be advised that **you can use any plumbing company recognized by Manatee County** to correct the matter. After the matter is fixed, the plumbing company you use should submit the proper certification for you to Manatee County.

Please note that failing or passing a backflow may be a subjective matter. Some situations are not clear-cut and are open for interpretation. This usually happens when wear is discovered in one of the backflow's elements. While one company may feel this wear warrants a repair (i.e. fail certification) another may suggest waiting a little bit longer before performing the repair (i.e. pass certification) and vice versa. In these situations, residents might be left uneasy, thinking the vendor might have provided them with a false report. However, please understand that this is not the

case. With the above in mind, The WaterWorks' goal is to ensure residents' satisfaction while meeting Manatee County requirements.

Long-Term Landscape Report – During a recent Board of Directors meeting, the Long-Term Landscape Group presented its final report. For those who may not recall, the group was established back in 2017 with the goal to develop “a long-range plan for the Community landscaping infrastructure. This will ideally be a top to bottom review; it should layout where we are, and where we want to go, with clear steps as to how we get there. This effort should not discount the possible need for short-term goals within a longer-ranging master plan.”

In more simple terms, the group had to create a long vision landscape architecture design to achieve a unified environmental and aesthetic look for LakeRidge Falls' common landscape areas. In doing so, the group established eight core guidelines:

- Establish a 10-Year-Plan;
- Use Florida Friendly and Tropical Plants;
- Utilize easy to maintain plant material;
- Create a Park Like Setting;
- Avoid Queen Palms while using more Foxtail and Pygmy Palms;
- Acknowledge that Oak Trees are here to stay;
- Follow the notion that Less is Better;
- Ensure the Tier Effect continues throughout.

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Then, the group divided the community into sections. For the past three years, the group was working, among other things, on architectural landscape designs, with the help of West Bay's landscape architects and designers. Thanks to the hard and dedicated work of the group, for example, the Association was able to enhance the landscaping around the community's amenity centers in phases and within reasonable financial boundaries. We were also able to start the enhancement project of the Association main Blvd.

Following the presentation, the Board of Directors thanked the members of the committee and adopted their report. This will be a great opportunity to take a moment and thank the members of the group, Mrs. Nancy Blair, Ms. Sandy Hasenjager, Mrs. Barbara Weintraub, and Mrs. Irene Wolfe, for their hard and dedicated work and more importantly, as you will witness shortly, for an utterly amazing job. With this, please note that four years of hard work came to an end and therefore the group was disbanded. Hurricane Season – June 1st marked the official start of the 2021 Atlantic hurricane season. Remember, we hope for the best but

prepare for the worse. Please make sure you are prepared.

Trespasser – Last month, we got reports of a shady-looking individual who was walking door to door along Cascade Falls Drive attempting to solicit business for a window product of some sort. Of course, this individual entered the community without permission. Thereafter, the officer on duty at the gatehouse placed a call with the Manatee County Sheriff's Office reporting a trespasser while I went to locate the individual in order to ask him to leave. By the time I was able to locate him, a Sheriff's Deputy arrived on the scene making sure to detain this individual. He was removed thereafter from the community not to come again. With this in mind, this is a great opportunity to once again urge all residents not to confront trespassers. Instead, please call the Manatee County Sheriff's Office immediately or at minimum inform the gatehouse. Of course, the Association will take any action needed to ensure such incidents will be handled in the same manner in the future. We wish to thank you in advance for your cooperation and understanding on this matter.

Unauthorized Vehicles at the Back Gate – On a related issue, the Security Committee discussed the issue of unauthorized vehicles that are sneaking into the community from the Residents-Only gate, located off Lockwood Ridge Rd. After looking into this matter, the committee learned that such offenders usually argue, when intercepted, that their GPS routed them to the back gate of the community. Thinking this is the only access point to the community or simply attempting to save time, as the offenders advised, they decided to "piggy-ride" behind or next to a resident of the community.

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During this meeting, Mr. David Hoecker, a member of the committee, suggested, and the committee later agreed, to report this mapping problem to the various GPS consumer devices and app providers. Following the meeting, we contacted Google Maps, Waze (a sister company of Google), and MapQuest. We are happy to announce that MapQuest addressed our concern. Unfortunately, we have yet to hear back from Google Maps and Waze. Therefore, it will be extremely helpful if residents can assist us in this endeavor.

If you have a [Waze](#) and/or [Google](#) account, we ask that you please report a mapping error on the road segment of Lockwood Ridge Rd and LakeRidge Blvd. In the note section, please enter “residents only access.” Hopefully, the more reports sent the better our chances of vendors and guests being directed to the main gate. This will, hopefully, help in reducing the undesirable phenomena of unauthorized vehicles sneaking into the community. If you know of another GPS service provider that directs its customers to the back gate of the community, please visit the [U.S. government official information website \(https://www.gps.gov/support/user/mapfix/devices-and-maps/\)](https://www.gps.gov/support/user/mapfix/devices-and-maps/). On this website, which was shared with us by Mr. Hoecker, you would find links for well-known providers such as TomTom, Uber, and Apple Maps. Each link will direct you to the provider website and instruct you on how to report an issue.

We wish to thank you in advance for your assistance on this important matter.



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Hurricane Season is Here - Again



Once again, the temperature and humidity are up which means summer is approaching and with it comes Hurricane Season. What is not up is your time to prepare. As the coronavirus impacts start to ease and we start moving back towards more normal activities, do not forget to keep preparation for a potential hurricane or severe storm impact on your “to-do” list. You may still have some of those supplies that you stashed away last year, but whether you have used them or even forgotten about them, it is time to take inventory, refresh your stock and get ready in the event those supplies are needed. Update your plan and adjust it for this season’s circumstances. Review the LRF Hurricane Preparedness Manual and review the Manatee County Disaster Planning Guide – it has been updated and copies of the revised guide should be available at the clubhouse. You can also view the Manual on the LRF website under the Policies tab and the Manatee County Planning Guide plus much more emergency planning information at: [Publications - Manatee County \(mymanatee.org\)](https://www.mymanatee.org)

Once again forecasts indicate that an above normal number of storms are expected this year. While an increased number of storms does give a greater chance of an impact to our local area, even a season with only one storm would be a disaster if that one storm hits you. So be ready. Make a plan. Consider holding a personal drill to see if your plan is adequate. Remember that Lakeridge Falls is not in an evacuation zone and it is not likely that flooding due to storm surge would be a hazard, but we still could be impacted by high winds and could potentially lose electricity. If loss of power would create a life threatening condition, make sure you have alternative arrangements made. Your plan should include communications with someone locally and someone outside the area who knows what you plan to do and if you plan to go somewhere else to ride out the storm. Check with your neighbors to see what their plans are and let them know what you are going to do. Protect important documents (ID’s, Insurance, Deeds, etc.) or be prepared to take them with you if you go someplace else during the storm.

If you are leaving the area for the season, make sure you make provisions for the protection of your property **before you leave**. Contract with a service or arrange for someone to put up storm shutters or otherwise secure your property. Put away any outside items that may be blown away or blown into your neighbors’ homes in the event of high winds.

In the event that conditions require that the plan be activated, members of the hurricane preparedness team will be securing the community facilities in advance of severe weather. If you are available and able to assist with putting away the pool furniture and other tasks, provide your contact information to Oded. We will contact you when preparation activities are scheduled - your help will be needed and is greatly appreciated. The Hurricane Preparedness Team, working together, is essential to the successful response to a severe weather event. **Let’s be prepared!**
