Here are the more important stories we had this past and upcoming weeks:

<u>Pool Hours</u> - As you may know, the pool operation hours are from dawn to dusk. We can go into great detail and explain that dawn is when the center of the sun is 6 degrees below the horizon while dusk is the moment when the center of the sun is 6 degrees below the horizon. But it is irrelevant. What is relevant, however, is that based on the current dawn to dusk the pool hours are 6:45 am to 6:40 pm.

<u>New Gate Access System</u> – Back in August of last year, we reported that due to a lightning incident, the computer at the gatehouse crashed, which prevented accessibility to electronically stored data. As one can imagine, this had an impact on administration procedures as security officers at the gatehouse had to manually admit vendors and guests as opposed to electronically doing so. While purchasing a new computer is not a major task, shopping for a cloud computing application that allows the Association to store information on a remotely secured server was not an easy task for several reasons.

First, availability. While there are several software programs designed to administrate vendors and guests for a wide variety of businesses, there are not many out there that were developed to address the needs of homeowner associations. Secondly, cost. As one can reasonably assume, a software application for a niche market is something that could not be an inexpensive endeavor. Finally, demand. Because of the limited supply of products, there is a high demand for such software applications.

Of course, the Security Committee and the Board of Directors wasted no time and started looking into alternatives and possible solutions to this matter. Following comprehensive research, the Board of Directors approved back in October of last year a recommendation by the Security Committee to enter an agreement with Applications by Design, Inc. (ABDI), a leading company in this niche industry. We are happy to announce that after a long waiting period, the Association is in the last stages of implementing this new gate access system.

During the first stages of using the ABDI software, the Association will use the same methods it used in the past. That is, security officers will be directed to look up information and log in visitors based on an approved list of guests or a phone call authorization. The exciting news regarding the new software is that it is based on different modules. In other words, the Association can add, and remove, features to the software based on the needs of its members. For example, one of ABDI's more popular modules is GateAccess.net. This allows residents to modify and view their approved guest list and information, which can come with apps for iPhone and Android.

With the above in mind, we kindly ask for the assistance of all residents. Mainly, residents are asked to provide our offices with an updated RESIDENT SECURITY FORM, which is attached to this communication. Please make sure to fill this form out and drop it or email it to our offices. The sooner, the better. This way we can ensure

we have the most recent and up-to-date information on each resident which will tremendously assist in the seamless administration of vendors and guests.

**Residents Directory** – Everything will go according to plan, on Tuesday we will send the 2024 Residents Directory to production. This means that this is indeed the last opportunity for residents to add or update (no need to submit a form if you don't wish to make a change from last year's directory) any piece of information, i.e., name spelling, phone number, and/or email address, before the directory is sent for printing.

If you wish to make any additions and/or updates, please fill out a new Residents Directory and Mass Email Distribution Information Form, which can be found on the <u>Association website</u>. After obtaining the form and filling it out, please return the form to the LakeRidge Falls office no later than <u>Monday, February 12<sup>th</sup>, at noon</u>.

<u>Smoke Detectors</u> – Recently, one of LakeRidge Falls' residents shared with us that according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) smoke detectors must be replaced every 10 years. Acting on a very important point, we urge all residents to inspect, and if needed replace, their smoke detectors. Below are two important safety tips by NFPA regarding smoke alarms. Please take action on this important matter.



#### SAFETY TIPS

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom. They should also be outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home. Install alarms in the basement.
- Large homes may need extra smoke alarms.
- It is best to use interconnected smoke alarms.
   When one smoke alarm sounds, they all sound.
- Test all smoke alarms at least once a month.
   Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working.
- Current alarms on the market employ different types of technology including multi-sensing, which could include smoke and carbon monoxide combined.
- Today's smoke alarms will be more technologically advanced to respond to a multitude of fire conditions, yet mitigate false alarms.
- A smoke alarm should be on the ceiling or high on a wall. Keep smoke alarms away from the kitchen to reduce false alarms. They should be at least 10 feet (3 meters) from the stove.
- People who are hard-of-hearing or deaf can use special alarms. These alarms have strobe lights and bed shakers.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old.


