LakeRidge Falls Art League

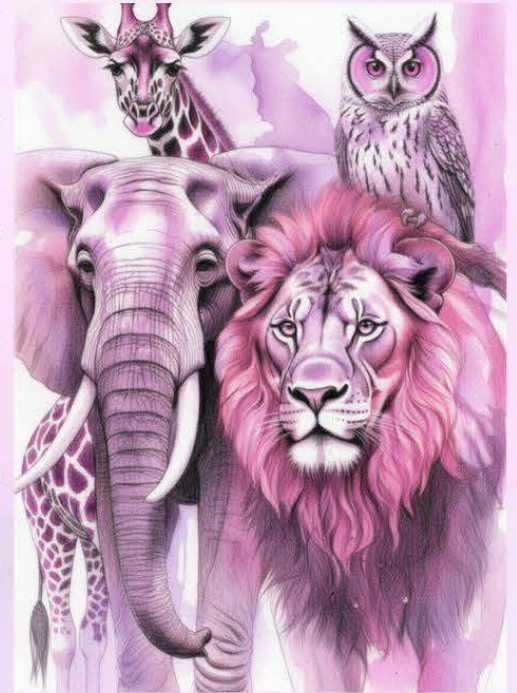

COMMUNITY MANAGER REPORT - ODED NEEMAN

2025 FINANCIAL AUDIT – We are happy to announce that the 2025 Audit of LakeRidge Falls’ financials has been completed, and copies are now available on the Association’s Engage Portal. As in the last few years, the audit was performed by Braxton & Holway, P.A., a reputable CPA firm located in Bradenton. It is important to note that Braxton & Holway is a member of both the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the Florida Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Braxton & Holway indicate in their report that:

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Lakeridge Falls Community Association, Inc., which comprise the balance sheet as of December 31, 2025, and the related statements of revenues, expenses, and changes in fund balances and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Lakeridge Falls Community Association, Inc. as of December 31, 2025, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Of course, a big thank you is warranted to the 2025 Budget Committee, the Treasurer, and the Board of Directors for an exceptional job.

BACKFLOWS – By now, members should have received notices from the Manatee County Utilities Department (MCUD) reminding them about the requirement to conduct an annual certification test of the backflow prevention device. For those who may not be aware, the backflow prevention device is the standing C-shaped pipe next to the sidewalk in front of the house. The backflow is designed to protect the drinking water from being polluted by contaminated water due to reduced pressure in the county water system. For this reason, MCUD requires that all homeowners in the county perform a yearly test to ensure the backflow prevention device is operating properly.

As it does every year, the Association contracts with a Certified Backflow Prevention Assembly Service Provider to perform this task for you. We are more than happy to announce that this year the work will be conducted by [Green Coast Backflows](#), which was highly recommended by at least a dozen members of the community. They are scheduled to start on the week of June 1st.

Here is a quick recap of how the work would take place:



- Green Coast Backflows will inspect all 399 backflows in the community.
- Once completed, Green Coast Backflows will submit the proper forms to the MCUD on behalf of the homeowners.
 - If passed, Green Coast Backflows will install a tag on the backflow. The tag indicates the month the certification took place and more importantly that the backflow passed the certification test.
 - If a backflow fails inspection, Green Coast Backflows will place a door hanger notification at the residence with their contact information.
 - Homeowners may contact/hire Green Coast Backflows directly to discuss the type of repair needed/hire them to perform the repair. Green Coast Backflows’ prices should range from \$289 to \$319 depending on the backflow’s model. Or,
 - Homeowners may choose any Certified Backflow Prevention Assembly Service Provider to correct the matter.
- Regardless of the vendor selection, the Certified Backflow Prevention Assembly Service Provider should submit the proper forms with MCUD once the repair work is completed.

We wish to thank you in advance for your attention to this important matter.

THE POND THAT STARTED IT ALL –When explaining what the Enlightenment is, Immanuel Kant, an 18th-century German philosopher, wrote:

“Enlightenment is man’s emergence from his self-imposed nonage. Nonage is the inability to use one’s own understanding without another’s guidance. This nonage is self-imposed if its cause lies not in lack of understanding but in indecision and lack of courage to use one’s own mind without another’s guidance. Dare to know! (Sapere Aude.) ‘Have the courage to use your own understanding,’ is therefore the motto of the Enlightenment.

The Association’s Age of Enlightenment, or maybe better put, the Age of Reason, officially started in 2015. While the issue of pond bank erosion was noted before, a minor erosion repair that resurfaced in 2015 was triggered by a decade-long work that involved many members of the community, professionals, and scholars. Here is a short taste of how things evolved in the community.

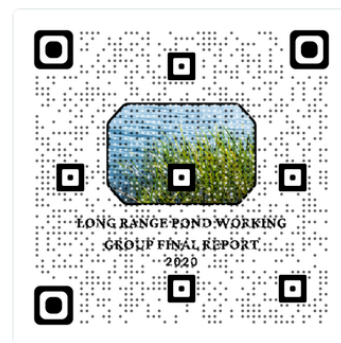
At some point in time, a minor erosion was noted along Pond 11. In order to address it, a honeycomb ground stabilization material was installed, filled with dirt, and then sodded. A couple of years passed, and the erosion resurfaced. Therefore, Cardno Entrix, LakeRidge Falls’ pond maintenance company at the time, installed septic stones at the bottom of the eroded area, laid erosion fabric and topsoil on top of the septic stones, and installed sod on top of the erosion fabric and topsoil. To “seal the deal,” Cardno Entrix installed rip-rap stones along the bank. Well, it didn’t take long, less than two years to be exact, before the area eroded again...

As a result, and for several others, the Board of Directors established in late 2017 the Long Range Ponds Working Group (PWG). There were several reasons for establishing the group:

- The group “was to study and make recommendations for remediation of current erosion problems.”
- The group had to collect data, analyze the problem, and document its actions for future reference.
- The group had to draft a long-term plan to stabilize and/or minimize future erosion of the stormwater drainage ponds.

In conducting the work, the group was given access, under its written charter, to professional, engineering, or other help it may deem necessary. It should be noted that the group was composed of community members who had extensive relevant backgrounds to the subject matter.

It took two and a half years of extensive and dedicated research for the PWG to publish its 63-page report. Please us QR code to read the report. One of the more important points the PWG made in the report is that it **“...was not able to recommend a simple solution for the current problem sites with eroding banks. Specifically, runoff across berms and backyards with heavily concentrated flows of rain runoff. Burying newly installed downspouts should help, but will not mitigate existing conditions for the most part. Rip rapping may be a part of the solution, but we do not have a current test site. It may be also useful to revisit the no-mow approach. These or other solutions should be considered in the future.”**



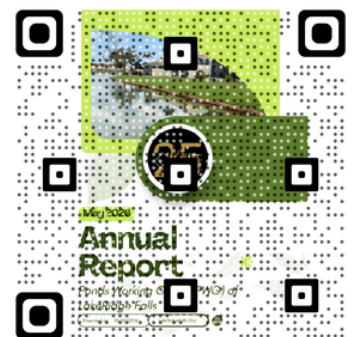
Acting on these findings and recommendations, the next few years were invested in implementing as many fiscally and operationally feasible erosion control measures. Furthermore, the various Boards of Directors and Roads & Grounds Committees continued to research the matter, meet with professionals and scholars, perform many site visits outside the community, evaluate new methods that emerge to the market, and document such efforts. More importantly, the Association started to implement several test sites, with two of them being the more well-known than the others, i.e., Pond Project 8 (riprap, burying downspout, and catch basins), and the work on Pond 14 behind the waterfall (riprap).

In early 2023, the Roads & Grounds Committee, with the blessing of the Board of Directors at the time, of course, established the Ponds Crew. In general, the Crew's task was to survey the Association ponds, identify erosions and other issues that may impact the structural integrity of the ponds, and measure the extent of the erosions along the edges of the ponds. It took this group six months of physically inspecting, measuring, and documenting the ponds, and in August of that year, an impressive and well-documented 135-page report of its findings and conclusions was produced for the Board of Directors' review. By this point, it was clear that the traditional methods were inadequate, ineffective, unimplemented, and/or prohibitive to the unique challenges the Association is facing. Therefore, a new approach took shape: the courage to use the Association's own knowledge and understanding. After all, many of the Association's members have gained valuable knowledge and experience on this subject matter by this time. Therefore, traditional methods that have proven to be unsuccessful made room for new ideas and approaches from similar applications. As a result, new methods, which use coconut nettings, coir logs, and PondTech Planks, were implemented. To ensure these new methods are documented and researched properly, the Board of Directors established a new PWG. And why is it important?

Well, the newest PWG presented its Annual Report to the Board of Directors during today's monthly meeting. It will be unjust not to allow the report to speak for itself. Please, and again please, make sure to take a look at this impressive and well-documented 66-page report using the QR code.



We are certain all members and residents of this community would join us in sharing our deepest appreciation to the members of the Pond Working Group, **Mr. Bob James, Mr. Dick Dorn, Mr. Lanny Weintraub, Dr. Mark Lucas, Mr. Bob Rouleau, and Mr. Warren Ferry**, for their outstanding dedication and excellent work. There is no doubt that LakeRidge Falls' members and residents are the lighthouse for many others to follow. A powerful example of what a dedicated community can achieve when striving for success. Or in the words of Immanuel Kant, LakeRidge Falls dares to know!

BACK EXIT GATE – As reported a few weeks back, All Systems Go, the Association's new gate maintenance company, replaced some defective loops, loop detectors, and harnesses after residents experienced some delays leaving the community using the back exit gate. Soon after, however, a couple of the Security Committee members expressed valid concerns regarding the arm gates remaining open for too long. When addressed by this concern, All Systems Go advised that they set arm gates to remain open for six seconds to allow for a better flow of stack vehicles, which would prevent the arm gates from closing and not opening if a car does not enter the loop on time. Two options were presented to address the matter: a quick timer adjustment ora more involved change to the gate sequence.

After a report came in from a member of the community who witnessed a vehicle entering the community from the exit side, it was decided that an action is warranted, sooner rather than later. Therefore, two representatives of the Security Committee met with a representative of All Systems Go. Once the meeting was concluded, they recommended that the Board of Directors choose the more practical option, i.e., change the gate sequence, which will allow the arm gates to close after each passing car. Based on this recommendation, the Board of Directors requested that this adjustment work without delay. And indeed, All Systems Go was on-site last month, reprogrammed the gate sequence in a way that the arms close right behind the vehicle exiting, and ensured that if the exit loop is triggered, the arms will stay up until cleared. This is a great opportunity to thank the Security Committee and members of the community who, by being actively involved, assist in keeping the community safe and secure.

MONUMENT WATERFALL SURVEY RESULTS - The Board would like to thank the many owners in the community who took the time to complete the entry waterfall survey. The Association received 220 separate responses out of a possible 399, representing 55% of all Lots. That is an excellent response rate and reflects the high level of interest in the future of our Association. The following are the results.

Of the 220 responses:

- 108 (49%) favored keeping the existing waterfall.
- 112 (51%) favored exploring possible alternatives to the current waterfall.

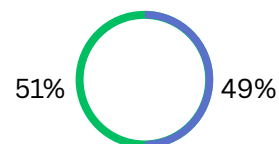
Because multiple selections were allowed for those choosing to explore alternatives, the 112 responses broke down as follows:

- 14 (9%) also chose keeping the existing waterfall.
- 32 (20%) wanted to explore a monument with a smaller waterfall.
- 59 (37%) selected a waterless monument with a lighted image or mural.
- 53 (34%) preferred exploring a waterless monument with traditional landscaping elements.

b) I/We support exploring possible alternatives to the current waterfall. **112**



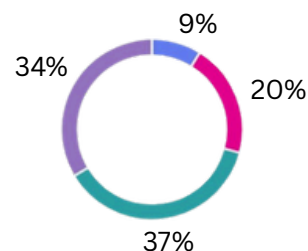
If alternatives were explored in the future, which options would you be open to consider?

During its May 8th meeting, the Board of Directors discussed the results of the survey conducted regarding the waterfall. Recognizing the strong but divided opinions within the community, the Board concluded that the most appropriate step at this time is to keep the waterfall operational while continuing to closely monitor ongoing maintenance considerations. We thank all residents who participated in the survey and appreciate your continued engagement in community matters.

As part of this decision, the Board also voted on dissolving the Waterfall Task Force. We are sure all would join us in expressing our sincere appreciation to the dedicated members of the Waterfall Task Force, **Dr. Mark Lucas, Ms. Mitch Matte, Mr. Greg Sabolsky, Mrs. Barbara Weintraub, and Mrs. Jan Wright**, for their hard work and commitment.

WATERFALL MAINTENANCE – Staying on the same matter, you surely noticed that the waterfall was tuned off last month for a period of about a week. This was done for a routine quinquennial maintenance work. During this project, PoolWerx, the Association pool and waterfall maintenance company, drained the waterfall, and Mr. Tamas Pataki, a reputable painter who works in the community for two decades now, pressure cleaned and thereafter painted the walls where the water is cascading, i.e., not the entire structure, and the letters/logo.

REJUVENATION PRUNING – Based on several service requests, the Landscape Committee asked during its last meeting that BrightView Landscape, the Association's landscape maintenance company, perform rejuvenation pruning, for lack of a better term. Rejuvenation pruning is an aggressive, yet beneficial, horticultural practice designed to restore overgrown, aging, or declining shrubs and plants. Unlike routine maintenance pruning, this method involves cutting plants back significantly to stimulate new growth and the overall appearance of plants that are overgrown. Therefore, and in the next couple of weeks, you may notice BrightView Landscape crews paying “extra attention” to hedges composed of plants such as arboricola, viburnum, etc., located along entryways, windows, and structures.

Therefore, residents may notice drastic, yet temporary changes in plant appearances. Some hedges may look “sticky” while others, as reported by a few residents in the past, may look as if they were “butchered.” Nevertheless, long-term results should be well worth it. The Landscape Committee thanks members and residents for their patience and understanding during this process.

LANDSCAPE SERVICE REQUEST – On a related matter, the issue of landscape service requests was brought up during a recent Board of Directors meeting. To make a long story short, the Board of Directors asked that a comprehensive directive guideline be posted for those residents who are seeking to obtain and thereafter submit such a form online.

How to Retrieve and Submit a Landscape Service Request Form at LakeRidge Falls' Website

Residents of LakeRidge Falls can easily request landscape services related to maintenance concerns by completing the official Landscape Service Request Form by following this simple step-by-step guide:

Step 1: Retrieve the Form

2. From the main menu, click on Forms.
3. On the Forms page, locate and click the link labeled: Landscape Service Request
4. The form will open as a fillable PDF (named "2025-LANDSCAPE-SERVICE-REQUEST-Fillable.pdf").

Step 2: Complete the Form

- Fill out all required fields directly in the PDF using your computer or tablet (no need to print first).
- Be as specific as possible about the issue or request (photos are always helpful).

- Submit the completed form to the Community Association Manager

 - Drop off a printed copy at the clubhouse office or at the designated mailbox across the office.

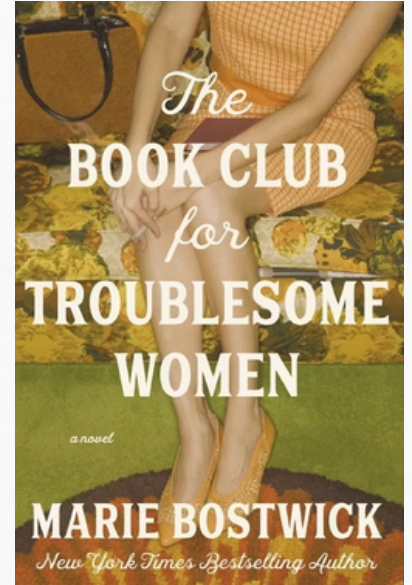
Troublesome Women

By 1960's standards, Margaret, Viv and Bitsy, suburban housewives living in a brand-new planned community in Virginia have it all. 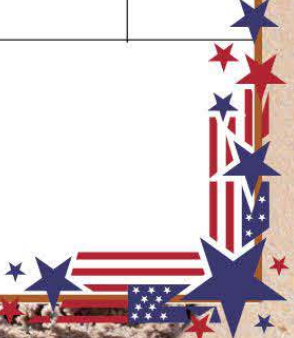
